Best Practices No. I

First Aid and Health Awareness Programme

Context:

This is a certificate introduction program to first aid training. It gives awareness to everyone about first aid treatment that can be given to someone who suddenly fell ill or injured. This program consists of explanation and demonstration of first aid knowledge and skills. First aid is applied to injured or ill persons in any health threatening settings in order to save life, prevent degradation of the situation or contribute to a treatment process.

In cases where a person will need help from a medical practitioner or nurse, first aid is treatment for the purpose of preserving life and minimizing the consequences of injury and illness, until such help is obtained. First aid covers initial treatment of any injury or ill-health suffered at work whether the cause is work related or not. An employer is required to provide adequate and appropriate facilities and equipment to enable first aid to be rendered to individuals if they become injured or ill at work. Trainees, undertaking work experience, have the same status as employees. This statutory duty is discharged as a line management responsibility at college. First aid is the initial assistance or treatment given to the students or employee at the site of accident to someone who is injured or suddenly fell ill, before the arrival of ambulance.

Objectives:

The following objectives are laid down to achieve the goal of the best practice activities-

1. To develop the knowledge and skills on first aid.
2. To enable students in recognizing the critical and life saving conditions for first aid.
3. To prevent the escalation of illness or injury.
4. To promote recovery norms from any type of casualties.
5. To make an awareness for incidence reporting for preserving and rescue of life.
6. To protect the unconscious with CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation).

7. To develop the accidental management leadership skill.

The Practice:

To perform these best practices following measures have been taken-

- The first aid emergencies such as unconsciousness, heat burns, external bleeding, epistaxis, heat stroke, drowning, shock, choking, electrocution, seizures, poisoning, animal bites, frost bite, foreign body in ears and eyes, angina pain, heart burn, fractures and dislocations were taught by experts. The participants were developed in the form of scenarios depicting real life situations and covered all the essential aspects of first aid.
- The Experienced Experts trained both students and all the staff.
- The both Students and staff involved in practical demo activities.
- The Experience Doctor presented the First Aid training by PPT.
- The experts provided both First Aids and Disaster management programme.
- The experts has been Conducted the Test providing question paper.
- Both students and Staff checked up their health by medical practitioner

Evidence of Success:

- Conducted written examination on First Aid.
- Both approximately 150 students and staff actively participated.
- Both students and Staff checked up their health by medical practitioner.

Impact:

This best practice is organized so that all the employees and students feel comfortable and secured. Training gives critical knowledge and confidence to effectively manage an emergency without fear or confusion. It also helps the first aid trainees or the students and teachers to know exactly what's in their first aid kits, how to use the contents, and the various ways to react in an emergency. In a beneficial way, it makes each employee an unofficial health and safety risk manager. It helps the trainees learn how to perform and use bandage injuries, and control blood flow – critical skills for emergencies anywhere, not just

the workplace. First aid is an important tool in quickly responding to accidents to ensure that injuries can be efficiently and promptly dealt with before a trained medical professional arrives to administer more specialized treatment. First aid in schools or in institution is especially helpful as children often get into accidents that can need swift care in order to prevent things from escalating. Whether it's a minor injury or something more serious like a fracture, preventing further complications is paramount. Ensuring there are trained first aiders within the college for creating a safer environment for everyone. Here are just some of the benefits that come from having a first aider on site. Since some accidents won't require any professional treatment provided injuries don't get aggravated, a speedy response from a first aider will prevent things from getting any worse and provide the necessary care. Becoming trained on first aid methods will help us to feel more secure and confident when deal with emergency situations as we will know the most efficient ways to deal with the situation. An added benefit of this is that the people around us, be it students or other teachers and staff, will also feel more reassured knowing that there are trained people on site during any emergency

Obstacles:

1. The students were not cautious and aware about First Aid training.
2. Students were not motivated to participate actively.
3. Due to busy semester schedule sufficient time for giving practical exposure is not possible.
4. Indifference attitude towards voluntary services in emergency situation.
5. Some students did not show the interest to participate in this programme.
6. Some female students hesitated to check up.

Best Practice No. II

Environmental Awareness

Goal:

To take initiative in creating Environmental awareness about importance of conservation and preservation of environment among students, staff, all stake holders of the college and community by setting our own example.

The institution has its own Green Policy Document for inculcating environmental awareness among all the stakeholders, conscious use of energy and water resources and making the campus litter free. Use of renewable energy, tree plantation drives, cleanliness drives, forest trails, heritage walks, trekking, waste management help to contribute towards environment sustainability. Awareness is spread through guest lectures, conferences, workshops, poster presentations, rallies, tree plantation, irrigation system etc.

Sustainable development is closely related to environmental awareness. The way of proper utilization and preservation of environmental resources can lead to enhanced sustainable development. In this regard, the development of environmental sustainability values among the students and stake holders can play a vital role to protect the world environment and its resources which

ultimately leads to sustainable development. Therefore, we should inculcate the various kinds of environmental values among students for protecting our environment and its valuable resources to enhance the sustainable development.

The Practice:

Various awareness drives, brainstorming sessions, eco-trail, heritage walk, Plastic collection and cleanliness drive, Poster competition, environment awareness rally, photo exhibition, tree plantation, conferences, seminar and workshops, plantation drive, trekking were organized for citizen, stakeholders and students.

1. Tree plantation-

The college initiated a tree plantation drive at the campus and surrounding areas. Every year about 150 saplings are planted and maintained by our staff members and students.

2. Rainwater harvesting-

Rain water harvesting, watering the plants through drip irrigation, leakage free pipelines and faucets, e-toilets etc. ensure controlled usage of water.

The Institution strives to make the campus a zero waste zone. 'Reduce, Recover, Recycle and Reuse' is the policy for waste management. The institution observes NO PLASTIC policy for all

the stakeholders. The biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste is collected separately in color code garbage bins.

3. Energy audit-

The college conducts energy and environmental audit every year. The college has optimized on the usage of Energy Efficient LED Fittings,

4. Waste Water Management-

Waste water from treated in the effluent water treatment plant and is made safe to use for watering the plants on campus. Organic solvents are recovered by using rotary evaporators and reused.

5. Vermicomposting-

A Bacterium Composting Unit is installed to create manure from kitchen waste of the canteen. Dry solid waste management is done in the proper way.

6. Cleanliness Drives-

The students and staff of NSS and college students regularly work for cleanliness campus. NSS volunteers collect 'Nirmalya' in *Ganesh Chaturthi* festival at Peth-Vadgaon near the college and convert it into organic manure. This activity is being conducted from long ago.

7. E-waste Management-

The administrative office is digitized to reduce usage of paper. All these efforts have contributed towards minimizing the usage of electricity, focusing on paperless work, initiating and maintaining a green campus, fulfilling the social commitment and creating environmental awareness among all stakeholders.

E-waste is generated from worn out computers, other hardware, mobiles, electric appliances etc. It consists of hazardous materials such as lead, zinc, lithium batteries, tin etc. Improper disposal of these products is dangerous for living beings. The e-waste and plastic waste is collected and given to this agency for proper disposal.

Evidence of Success:

The activities conducted under this best practice ensured heightened awareness and consciousness among students, faculty, stakeholders and community.
